The purpose of the RAMP form is:

- a) to identify all possible hazards
- b) to identify measures that will prevent, minimize or isolate all possible hazards
- c) in the event of harm befalling anyone, to identify the action to control and minimise the extent of an injury.

All Puzzling World staff working with Education group visits hold a valid First Aid Certificate, and are trained to provide a response in case of emergency.
